



Jockeys Raise Awareness, Funding for PDJF at Indiana Grand Racing & Casino

SHELBYVILLE, Ind. (July 26, 2018) – The Indiana Horsemen’s Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) will be trackside once again Saturday, July 28 for the second installment of the 2019 series “Grand Mornings at the Track.” The free breakfast event will begin at 9 a.m. in the Always Turned On tent at Indiana Grand.

“Grand Mornings at the Track” is a monthly series that offers racing fans a different perspective of Thoroughbred racing. The event begins with a free continental breakfast during morning training hours and will proceed to the jockey’s quarters. Racing fans will get a look at equipment used by jockeys as well as other facets of racing

from those who oversee operations in the paddock area. The event is provided by the Indiana HBPA and will conclude at approximately 10:30 a.m.

Free parking is also available for “Grand Mornings at the Track” in any of the parking areas at Indiana Grand. The event is open to all ages and guests 18 and over will also receive a free racing program for Saturday’s races beginning at 6:05 p.m.

“Grand Mornings at the Track” is slated for the fourth Saturday of each month. The next installment of the series open to the public is set for Saturday, Aug. 25 featuring a trip to the starting gate and Indiana Grand’s new track maintenance facility.

The 16th season of Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racing continues through Wednesday, Nov. 7. Racing is conducted Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 2:05 p.m. EST with Saturday racing beginning at 6:05 p.m. EST. Two special Thursday racing dates will be held July 19 and Sept. 6 with a 2:05 p.m. EST post time.
